THE CHEMISTRY EXHIBITION 2018

As a culmination to the eventful session of 2017-2018 Chemistry Club Effervescence organized a Chemistry Exhibition on Saturday, 10th February 2018. The exhibition was inaugurated by Principal Dr Vijay Datta. Students from Classes S1 to S4 and S6 participated in the exhibition. Experiments introducing greener alternatives for a healthy and sustainable future were displayed.

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Some eye catching experiments included the Neutralization Reaction, the Sound Wave Fire Extinguisher, Hydraulic Lift and Hydraulic Proclainer. The students made bio-plastic using glycerine, cornstarch and vinegar. Degradation of Styrofoam, electricity generation by electrolysis, cleaning of water using activated carbon, oil spill clean-up and iodine clock were some of the highlighted projects displayed in the exhibition. Spherification technique was demonstrated using sodium alginate and calcium lactate gluconate. Artificial rayon was made using copper carbonate, cotton and ammonium hydroxide. Chromatography experiments and electrolysis of tin chloride were demonstrated. Solar powered air purifier, auto charging shoe and road electricity generator were also put up and appreciated.

Display Boards showcasing the learning outcome of students through Chemistry activities were displayed. Fun learning through comic strips made by students of Classes S1 and S2 was a centre of attraction for all. This exhibition marked the celebration of science in a creative and innovative way.

The project was kicked off with an ice breaking session where they got to interact with fellow delegates. They worked at Khakhana village school, which is adopted by the Rajkumar College. Khakhana village is located in Wankaner Tehsil of Rajkot district in Gujarat. The students worked tirelessly for three days in the village school, which has about 500 children.

Pathway

The activity aimed at joining the school gate with the main road. Road construction involved the passing of heavy bowls in a chain like manner. Not only did the students fulfill the purpose of proving easy transporting roads, but also became stronger and gained more stamina. In the end, they were able to make a 200 metre metaled road.

Sitting Area
