## TEACHERS' WORKSHOP ON LAWS FOR CHILDREN

On 13<sup>th</sup> September, 2019, all the teachers and administrative staff of Modern School attended a workshop on 'Laws Concerning Children' at the HLL Auditorium. It was a highly interactive session in which the teachers shared their experiences and put up their queries related to this issue.
