

ORIENTATION PROGRAMME FOR PARENTS OF CLASS S1

A Special orientation programme was held for the parents of students of S1, on 2nd of April, 2016 at the H.L.L Auditorium. The aim of the orientation was to address various issues related to adolescence. COUNSELLING SESSION FOR STUDENTS OF CLASS

A two day counselling session for class S6 was held on 28th and 29th of March, 2016, at the H.L.L Auditorium. The workshop was conducted by 'One Step Up'. They worked individually with the students and imparted information on careers, courses and subjects in an engaging manner. The team conducted intensive programs where they introduced students to stream specific career options. The aim of the programme was to help students understand in depth what their stream choices will lead to in the future. The objective of the Class XI program was to help students think about stream specific career choices as well as options related to their interests so that they could be sure about the subjects that they should choose to pursue a specific career.

The under 19 cricket team of Modern School played an exhibition match with the team of Bishops Diocesan College, South Africa. Bishops is an independent boys' school in Cape Town. The match was played on 22nd of March, 2016, on the cricket ground of Modern School. Both the teams played enthusiastically and our school won by 5 wickets. The title of 'Man of the Match' was given to Ishant Dabla for an all-rounder performance for scoring 48 runs and taking 4 wickets.



WORKSHOP ON SUPER BRAIN YOGA

A training session on ‘Super Brain Yoga’ was held during the Junior Assembly on 29th of March, 2016. The workshop was conducted by Mrs. Navina Punj an expert in Super Brain Yoga and by Ms. Gursimran. Super brain yoga helps in sharpening the brain and improving memory. It is a simple, fast and drug-free method to improve mental energy, concentration and academic output. It is also very beneficial for students with learning disabilities. The students of class S2 and S3 tried to learn this method and participated in the workshop enthusiastically.

BEST HYGIENIC SCHOOL OF THE YEAR

National Institute of Cleanliness Education and Research awarded Modern School, the ‘Best Hygienic School of The Year’ award on 21st of March, 2016. The students of class S5 took up the issue ‘Sanitation in India’ through Project Citizen 2015. As a part of their action plan, they organized an Inter-house poster making competition for classes S4 and S5, which helped to spread awareness as well as encouraged the students to think of creative solutions. They also organized ‘Handwash Campaign’ for the students of middle school focused on promoting the habit of washing hands and emphasized the importance of personal hygiene in daily life. As a part of the same project, the students performed a ‘nukkad natak’ (street play) written by Team Project Citizen and directed by Ms. Sonia Kapoor at the weekly Raahgiri fest held at Connaught Place, New Delhi. They visited many areas to generate awareness among the people.

SELECTION IN CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE (GYMNASTICS)

The Junior Science Talent Search Examination (JSTSE), is held for students of class XI, studying in Delhi. It is organized at state level by the Science Branch, Directorate of Education, Government of NCT, Delhi. The examination tests the knowledge and skills of students in general science, mathematics and general knowledge. The scholarship is given to the top 150 students who appear for the examination. This year more than 22,000 students appeared for the same and Abhinav Agarwal, secured the 24th rank in JSTSE, 2015-16.

- Kanatal and Mussoorie

An educational trip was organized for the students of S1 to Kanatal and Mussoorie. A group of ninety six students accompanied by seven teachers went for the trip from 10th of March to 13th of March, 2016. It was a unique learning experience for the students to live in the arms of the beautiful mountains of Uttarkashi in Camp tents. Students enjoyed activities like Trekking and Flying fox. They also visited The Nehru Institute of Mountaineering which is rated as one of the best mountaineering institutes in India and also considered as the most prestigious mountaineering institute in Asia.
