PTA ACADEMIC AWARDS 2016

The mornings of 19th July and 20th July 2016 were filled with moments of pride and glory for parents, grandparents and children of Modern School. It was an event organised by the PTA to highlight the academic achievements of the students.

On 19th July, Modern School was honoured to have Ms. Shivani Pasrich, former Miss India, as the chief guest. Six children of class 9 were awarded for scoring CGPA 10 and a number of others were awarded for getting a CGPA 9.6-9.8. Sixty three children who scored a CGPA 10 in class 10 were awarded for their achievement. Toppers and highest scorers of classes 11 and 12 proudly received their awards. Ms. Pasrich spoke about the value of learning and how it gives us a strong personality.

On 20th July the students of present S2, S3 and S4, who scored a CGPA of 9.8 or 10 were presented with the award. The chief guest for the event was Professor Mukherjee of Delhi University, who gave an inspiring speech about having the courage and dedication to follow one's passion. Finally, Dr Vijay Datta, the Principal of Modern School, explained the importance of academics in achieving success in life.



PTA SPORTS AWARDS 2016

On 21st July, 2016, the PTA awards for excellence in Sports were presented to the meritorious students of Classes S1 to S7. The esteemed guest invited to honour and congratulate the children for their achievements in Sports was Mr. Atul Wassan, Former Indian Cricket Team fast bowler who is also a Commentator at major Sporting Events.
