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### 'SRJNA' WORKSHOP FOR SCIENCE TEACHERS

'SRJNA' presented a 'Learning by doing Workshop' held on 21<sup>st</sup> March at the Jr Bio Lab. It stressed on the use of real & virtual teaching aids to impart 5D classroom learning and smart online assessment platform with deep analytics for K-10 students, teachers and parents. Representative from 'SRJNA' foundation started with the Biology models and illustrated important systems of human body using a 'Torso model' which was compact and also multipurpose. Models of the human heart, lungs, ear etc were displayed to ensure experiential learning, which was very interesting and impactful. The uniqueness of the models is infact that they can be used for classes 6th to 12th. The second half of the workshop was devoted to the explanation of concepts of Physics, Momentum conservation, Centre of mass, effects of Electric current which were demonstrated using simple, handy and compact models. Understanding key concepts through these models can help in bridging a gap between a slow learner and a fast learner. Education can be simplified manifolds with the help of these models.
