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NAIRONG INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS CONFERENCE

A team of five students from Modern School attended the Nairong International Students Conference organised by Matthayom Watnairong School, Thailand from 31st July to 3rd August 2017. The theme of the conference was 'A Better World In Our Hands'. It began with an interactive session with Mr Jerlad Tan, a renowned TV news reporter at Al Jazeera. This was followed by an ice-breaking session consisting of many innovative games prepared by the core team. Mr. Surapong Ngamsom, the Principal of the host school, organised the teacher's session to help educators adapt to the Google classroom.

The following day, the delegates were taken on a field trip to the Burapha University where Assistant Professor Phiangphak Sukkharak lectured about the diversity in both plant and animal species. The delegates then visited the Marine Institute of the University which was followed by a ride in the wilderness of the Tiger Park. The day ended with the students witnessing a breath taking cohesion of live action and cinema at the KAN Show. The event was a highly enriching experience for the students.



ASTRONOMY WORKSHOP

“Yeh Taara Woh Taara”

The students of Astronomy Club of Modern School visited the Nehru Planetarium on 26th July for the show “Yeh Taara Woh Taara”. Seventeen children from the club visited the Planetarium. The students learnt how sunlight reaches the earth in 8 minutes . They saw the formation of the Great Square of Pegasus, the clown face shape in the sky called the Eagle. Children also learnt about Sky Mapping. They were told about Sher Mandal (Purana Quila) built by Sher Shah and modified into an observatory by Humayun . The students were informed about the Jantar Mantar being a naked eye observatory used to find positions of stars. They were also informed about “Watch Dog” constellation. Finally they were briefed about the Saptarishi and its influence on the poet Kalidasa.

NATIONAL YOUTH PARLIAMENT ‘CHANAKAYANITI’

Prajna Chaudhary (S6-I) bagged the Best First Time Parliamentarian Award in the Chanakayaniti National Youth Parliament held on 29-30th July 2017.
