COMMUNITY

Modern School at Barakhamba Road is a co-educational high school which opened in 1920. The sprawling 25 acre campus in the heart of the capital, houses one of the premiere and foremost public Schools of the country.

A product of visionary heads, the school is secular in nature and believes in imparting education free from all reservations and prejudices. The student body is culturally Indian. It is part residential thus extending opportunities to outstation students as well. The hostel is only for boys

School

Modern School Barakhamba Road enrolls 2500 students in grades 6-12 with a graduating class of 380. The average number of students in each section of a class is 40.

The school academic year starts from April and closes in March. However, the class X and XII graduate in the third week of May.

The school is affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE). It offers a secondary curriculum from class VI- X, at the end of which the students take the AISSE (All India Secondary School Examination). Thereafter they progress to the Higher Secondary Stage for 2 years and graduate after taking the AISSCE (All India Senior School Certificate Examination).



Curriculum:

All courses bear the same level of difficulty. This means that the courses are not honors accelerated etc. The courses studied bear the same rigor and are of equal weightage.

Classes IX and X

Subjects/Courses:

5 subjects are taken of which two must be languages

1. English. Compulsory for all.
 2. Second language: the student can opt for a native or foreign language. Most popular options are Hindi, Sanskrit or French.
 3. Mathematics with laboratory work
 4. Sciences with Laboratory Practical – Physics, Chemistry, Biology.
 5. Social Science – History; Geography; Economics and Democratic Politics
- Additional Subjects: -Computer Science & Applications, Socially

Along with these subjects the student takes classes in Computer Science & Applications, Socially Useful Productive Work (SUPW) and Physical and Health Education and receives a Co-Scholastic grade on it.

All subjects have classes with project and assignments. Generally the students study these subjects in class periods of 35 minutes each, the numbers of periods for each subject are scheduled in a time table from 7:50am – 1:50 pm, Monday to Friday.

Examination Specifications and Grades

- **For the Annual Examination, 100% syllabus of the subject will be covered.**
Note: Class IX annual Examinations is conducted by the school whereas Class X students appear for National Level Examinations conducted by CBSE.
- **PT1: Periodic Test 1**
[Test will cover the first 30% of the syllabus]
- **PT2: Periodic Test 2**
[Test will cover second 30% of the syllabus + one third of PT1 syllabus]
- **PT3: Periodic Test 3**
[Test will cover third 30% of the syllabus + One third of PT1 syllabus
+ One third of syllabus covered between periodic Test 1 and periodic Test 2]



Classes XI and XII

Curriculum:

As per the CBSE scheme of studies, the students take two years of the same subjects in the higher secondary i.e. year XI and XII.

Each student is required to opt for one compulsory language at the core level along with four electives. The school offers these four subjects under three streams; Science. Humanities and Commerce. The details are as follows:

Compulsory Subject for all

- English

Four electives under any of one of the following three streams

Humanities

- Economics/Geography/Home Science/Physics/Business Studies
- Mathematics / Physical Ed./Political Science/Multimedia & Web Tech/Fashion Tech
- Psychology/ Mathematics /Physical Education
- History/Mathematics/Economics/Painting

Science

- Physics
- Chemistry
- Biology/Computer Sc./Bio-Tech./Economics / Multimedia & Web Tech/Fashion Tech.
- Mathematics /Psychology/ Physical Edu.

Commerce

- Business Studies
- Economics
- Accountancy
- Mathematics/ Multimedia & Web Tech/Fashion Tech/ Physical Education.

Along with these subjects every student also takes classes in the following ungraded subjects.

Classes XI and XII

Examination Specifications and Grades

Each academic session begins in the month of April. Two rounds of Unit Tests are conducted through the year. The first round is completed before the Half-Yearly Examination in September-October and the second round between October and February. The Annual Examinations are conducted at the end of the session in March.

The weightage, in the Annual Report, of the tests and examinations conducted during the year, is as follows:

The final report card shows aggregate marks in all subjects calculated as per the above weightage.

Promotion Policy for XI

Pass Marks in each subject is 33%. A student has to get at least 33% in the theory of the Annual Examination, Half Yearly Examination and Unit Tests.

In subjects having Practical/Projects, students are required to pass in theory and practical/projects separately with 33% aggregate marks.

CLASS XII

Besides the Annual Board Examinations conducted by CBSE, the school will be conducting the following Examinations for Class S7 Students:

- (i) First round of Unit Tests (before the Half Yearly Examination)
- (ii) Half Yearly Examination (in September- October)
- (iii) Second round of Unit Tests (in November)
- (iv) Pre Board Examination (in December- January)



EXAMINATION SPECIFICATIONS AND RANKING

The **All India Senior School Certificate Examination (AISSCE)** is held from March to April of class 12. It is a national level examination conducted at the same time in all CBSE schools of India.

The school also conducts Mid Year Examinations and Pre Board Examinations to monitor the formative growth of the students.

A sample of the High School Transcript with the class 12 predicted marks with respective grades is given below:

The scores are on a scale of 0-100 .With a pass mark of 33%. The predicted grades are based on the super score/grade of each subject of the 11th grade aggregate marks and the performances in the unit tests in grade 12th with one upgradation in positional grade.

External Board Examination
