## **VIRUS 2020**

Bluebells School International, Kailash Colony, New Delhi organized VIRUS 2020 - an online Computer Science based event on the 2<sup>nd</sup> December, 2020.

Modern School Barakhamba Road, sent teams for each of the four events, which tested the skills of the participants such as critical thinking, problem-solving, graphic designing, pitch presentation and creativity. Aryan Dawer (S6-C) and Anirudh Jain(S6-C) won the First position in the Python Polemos event. The participants had to come up with dexterous ways to solve problems based on Python followed by a quiz on the same subject. Salil Jain(S6-I) and Kush Garg(S5-D) secured the Second position in the Pixellence event where the participants had to use their technical skills and creativity to design a composition (Digital Image) on a topic given on the spot. Pradyumn Arora(S6-I) and Navyansh Pant(S5-C) won the Third position in the Br(AI)nstorming event. The participants had to prepare a PowerPoint presentation and video explaining an idea or concept that they had to implement using artificial intelligence. In the final round, the students had to debate the legitimacy and efficiency of their idea against those of other participants. Bhanu Pratap (S4-D) and Ojas Kalra (S4-B) participated in the gaming event – Armageddon. The participants had to use their cognitive abilities to compete in games like 'Brawlhalla' and 'Rocket League'. Four matches were held over a period of two

days.
