SCHOOL TO REOPEN FOR GRADES X AND XII

The School has made arrangements for students of classes X and XII to attend the School, on voluntary basis, from 27th January 2021 for class XII and 1st February 2021 for class X. The school will assure that all safety measures/precautions will be taken.

- Classes will be conducted from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. as per the Schedule.
