The Interact Club of Modern School, Barakhamba Road has an unmatched record of community service for the past two and a half decades. Today, when every household, community and nation is reeling from the impact of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19), the students of Interact Club continue to keep the flag flying high in the field of community service. In an effort to do so, they have initiated a variety of endeavours.

- On the occasion of World No-Tobacco Day, 31<sup>st</sup> May 2020, students of the Interact Club actively participated in an online competition held by **The Indian Cancer Society** on the **WHO** theme "Protecting Youth from industry manipulation and preventing them from tobacco and nicotine use". Students of class S1 to S6 participated in T-shirt designing, creating a jingle, creating a comic strip and writing an illustrated story. Out of the 38 entries received by the Indian Cancer Society, Arnav Sharma (S6E) secured the **Third Prize** for writing an illustrated story.
- During May-June 2020, an activity was organised for students of class S1 to S7 to express their creativity and talent in unique and fascinating ways. Students were encouraged to pen down their thoughts in the form of an essay, self-composed poem, story, painting, photography or their personal experiences on the topics like 'The Joy of Giving', 'There is a Light at the end of every Tunnel', 'We can Save Lives' and 'Modern Day Superheroes'.
- A Happiness Webinar was organised by the District Interact Team on 25<sup>th</sup> April, 2020. The session was led by Mr Sandeep Vaswani who is a CEO- Coach, Senior Management consultant, 'Art of Living' faculty. During these unprecedented times, he talked about the importance of keeping calm. He stressed on the importance of yoga and meditation.
- On 25<sup>th</sup> May, 2020 four hundred and thirty hand-made masks were distributed at the Cheshire Home, New Delhi on behalf of Modern School, Barakhamba Road by Neha Gupta (S7I).
- In an effort to extend their support to those affected by/vulnerable to the novel coronavirus, the members of Interact Club initiated efforts on a personal level as well.

They started fundraising campaigns to help the needy. They also provided equipments like suction machines, pulse oximeters and spray machines. The students and their families conducted food distribution drives across Delhi and other parts of the country.

Keeping in mind the club motto 'Service above Self', the students of Interact Club strive to make their efforts and continue reaching out to the underprivileged.



#### **CHESHIRE HOME VISIT**

## THE BLIND RELIEF ASSOCIATION: WHERE POSITIVITY PERVADES EVERY CORNER

Students engage with local communities and such experiences that stretch them beyond their perceived capabilities. Amidst the ongoing Covid-19 Pandemic, Modern School started a laudable initiative, 'Ask to Mask', donating masks to old age homes, orphanages and blind schools across Delhi.

A visit to The Blind Relief Association was organised by the Interact Club on 22<sup>nd</sup>September, 2021. Kamakshi Gupta(S6J), Avika Mittal(S6J), Ayaana Jain(S6J), Anmol Jain(S6I) and Nikeeta Singh(S6J), accompanied by Ms Poonam Rajput. The Blind Relief Association, Delhi, a premier non-governmental organization in the country has carved a niche for itself, empowering the visually impaired for seventy-five years. Provision of need-based services for the visually impaired to enable them to develop their latent talents and realize their fullest potential is what the Blind Relief Association, Delhi strives for. The students entered the hallowed turf of the Blind Relief Association, carrying over two hundred and fifty masks and fifty hand sanitizers. They were warmly greeted by the representatives of the Association, followed by a tour of the beautiful space many call home. The standard maintained by the institute towards hygiene, nutrition, shelter and skill training is commendable. A brief interaction with the staff occupied the centre-stage as it proved to be sufficient to gather the sincerity with which the institute is working. The sense of fulfillment is unexplainable. A truly inspiring and humbling experience, one that will remain etched in the memories of the students forever.

#### MASK DISTRIBUTION DRIVE

On 14th September, 2021, Mask Distribution Drive was initiated by our Principal, Dr Vijay Datta and was inaugurated by President Board of Trustees Ms Anuradha Singh in the School Premises. Eighteen members of the Interact Club, Modern School came to school to distribute the masks among the school helpers. There were forty students who took part in the drive. The students also distributed the masks in Palna Home, Cheshire Home and Blind School in New Delhi for the benefit of the underprivileged. Palna, a hope for many little smiles, is the home for abandoned homeless and destitute children. Till date, more than three thousand kids have been adopted. On 20th September, 2021, two students along with teacher in charge, Ms Deepa Kapoor visited Palna Home and distributed eight boxes of Masks along with two hundred packets of biscuits for children during Covid Pandemic. The mask distribution drive is still going on. The Interactors look forward to work towards the welfare of the society and serve the community.
