ROUND SQUARE VIRTUAL CONFERENCE, THE HUTCHINS SCHOOL CELEBRATIONS





Chittagong Grammar School hosted the CGS Virtual Youth Conclave 2021 from 19th to 21st November, 2021. The conference commenced with the keynote speaker, Ms Farin Daulat speaking about mental health and self-compassion as a follow-up activity that was sent to children prior to the conference where they could ask questions about their personal relationships, wellbeing and sexuality. These issues were also taken up in the latter part of the conference and students debated about the dilemmas regarding mental health and the effects of social media and body dysmorphia. This session helped students to think better and gain perspective.
