The delegation comprised of Kashish Sindhwani (S6-G), Anmol Jain, (S6-I), Mannat Sobti (S4-I), Ria Devika Bhasin (S4-A), andAmrish Walia (S4-A).

The delegation had very insightful sessions with all the speakers. Mr Hari Menon spoke about how creative the youth of India is and the possibility of India being a superpower in the future. Mr Kris Gopalkrishnan discussed the importance of commercial adaptability and shared his first-hand experience of failure and success in terms of innovation while working at



Infosys. Mr Ashwani Lohani spoke about the importance of always doing the right thing no matter the consequences.

EXPLORA 2022 - SCIENCE EXHIBITION

Modern School, Barakhamba Road participated in Annual Science Exhibition 'Explora-2022' conducted by The British School, New Delhi on 18th February 2022. The theme for the exhibition was 'Role of Science in Achieving Sustainable Development Goals'.

Students were asked to shoot videos for the exhibition applying scientific methods while suggesting solutions to meet United Nations' sustainable goals. All five videos made by Modern School students were selected for the final compilation under the able guidance of Ms Shalini Dhaiya and Ms Aarti Mehta.

Naman Khanna (S1-D) showcased water-based smoke sucking machine made from recycled materials which can reduce air pollution. Arnav Sadh (S2-G) made wind turbine – a sustainable, renewable, and clean energy source that has negligible impact on the environment compared to burning Udayan (S3-F) emphasised fossil fuels. Sikri on establishing cryptocurrency mining farms using renewable energy that can be instrumental in reducing poverty. Divij Wahi (S3-E) made models to explain techniques to deal with air and water pollution to help achieve climate action goals.



Nergis Malhotra (S3-E) made a Renewable Wave energy model to generate electricity addressing the sustainable development goal of clean energy. Students learnt about the United Nations' Sustainable Goals which stimulated their minds to think about how to protect their planet for future generations.

HARIT UMANG OLYMPIAD

The third webinar of the 'Harit Umang Olympiad', organised by Panasonic India was conducted on 25th January 2022. This webinar focused on conservation of biodiversity through tree plantation with a special emphasis on urban areas.
