Shweta Sehrawat is the Vice Captain of ICC U19 Women's T20 World Cup for the year 2023. She is a recent pass out of Modern School, Barakhamba Road in the year 2022 with 84.4% in her class 12 board exams. In India's inaugural match of the tournament, she scored 92* runs in 57 balls against South Africa, which included 20 fours. This led India to a win by 21 balls remaining, with **Sehrawat** named as **Player of the Match**.
