



This talk was followed by a walk through the farms and orchards there. The students got a chance to witness and learn about soil types, PH levels, methods of watering, insects

The students were fascinated by the hand painted murals and 3D relief paintings celebrating the Punjabi culture and heritage. This was followed by a visit to the holy Gurudwara Keshgarh Sahib where everyone paid their respect and experienced the grandeur of this sacred Pilgrimage Site. On the last day, the students were taken for motorboat ride at River Sutlej. The trip to Lalpur was an enriching experience where students truly got an opportunity to explore the rural richness of the villages, farms, and the cultural diversity it offers.
