46TH LALA RAGHUBIR SINGH HOT WEATHER CRICKET TOURNAMENT

The 46th Lala Raghubir Singh Hot Weather Cricket Tournament was conducted in School from 22nd May 2023 to 7th June 2023, in which twelve prestigious teams of Delhi and NCR competed. The matches were played on league-cum-knockout basis for forty overs from each side. Mr Ashok Pratap Singh, Former President, Board of Trustees, Modern Schools, was the Chief Guest and inaugurated the Tournament on 22nd May 2023.

Rannstar Cricket Club Team lifted the Winner's Trophy together with a cash prize of Rs2,50,000/. The Runner Up Trophy was bagged by Carpediem India with a cash prize of Rs1,50,000/-.
