Today, more than half the world's population lives in cities. By 2050, an estimated 7 out of 10 people will likely live in urban areas. Sustainable Development Goal 11, titled. "Sustainable Cities and Communities" is one of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals established by the United Nations General Assembly in 2015. The official mission of SDG 11 is to "Make cities inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable". In this poster I aim to create a city that thrives on sustainable living, an urban environment that respects both nature and the needs of its inhabitants.

Waste disposal is a big problem in Urban Cities. Through recycling, materials like paper, plastic, glass, and metal can be diverted from landfills and reintegrated into the production cycle. We should segregate our waste using colorful bins. Green for wet/ organic waste like vegetable and fruit peels, Blue for dry waste like plastic bottles, wrappers, cardboard, paper etc., and Black bin for electronic disposal like printer



cartridges, batteries, tube light etc. These bins serve as a visual reminder of the importance of segregating waste so that it can be recycled or disposed of more effectively instead of going into landfills. Adjacent to the waste bins, a **Composting area and Biogas plant** is shown. The Green Bin's organic waste can be converted into nutrient-rich compost to be used as manure in gardens or farming. Biogas or methane is also

generated in this process which is combustible and can be used as clean energy.

Dry waste can be recycled or upcycled using various methods.

Buildings can also be seen with cascading foliage and living walls which along with enhancing the aesthetics of the building will also clean the air around it.



The artwork radiates a sense of unity and shared responsibility, with an aim contributing to the greater goal of sustainable urban living. Through a symphony of colors and forms, I aim to envision a world where cities and communities thrive in harmony with nature, embracing innovation and conscious choices for the betterment of our shared future.


### **ROUND SQUARE – POSTCARD Theme: Democracy in Action**
