#### MOCK EVACUATION DRILL FOR STUDENTS

Spontaneity and decision making are the two most important tools to avert the damages caused by any natural or man-made disaster. The training to act wisely in such an unwelcome and dangerous situation should begin at the school in order to equip the students with skills to handle it effectively. On 9<sup>th</sup> October 2023, an evacuation drill was conducted at the campus by the Disaster Management Committee of the school. The purpose of this drill was to train the students on how to respond during a sudden calamity, such as an earthquake or a fire.

At 9:45 a.m., a long alarm bell was rung in all the three Blocks of the school. The students, along with their teachers, moved out of their classrooms in a line in an orderly fashion. They followed the evacuation route without panicking or cluttering the staircases and assembled in the fields.
