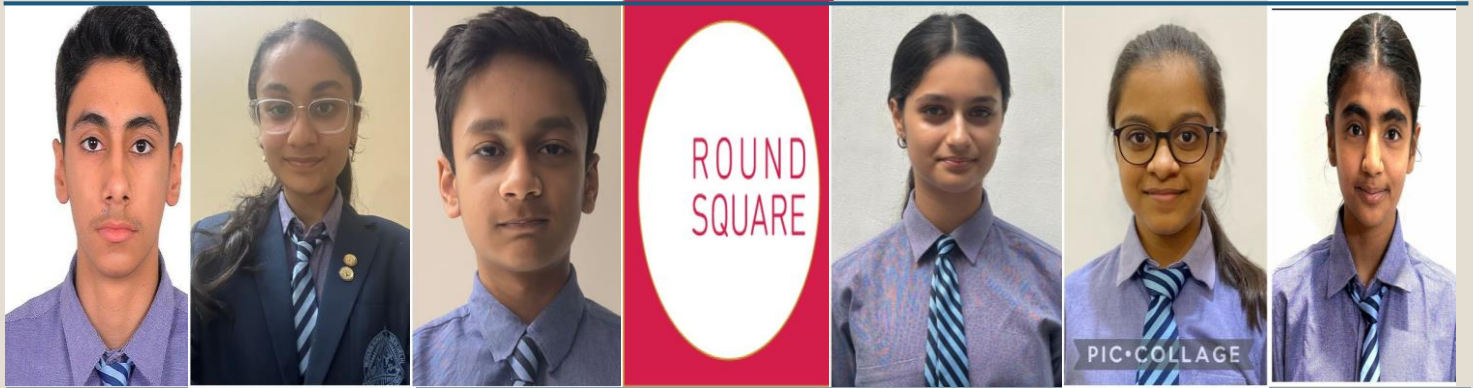
Modern School at MU20 Pathways Model United Nations

Earthquake Evacuation Drill

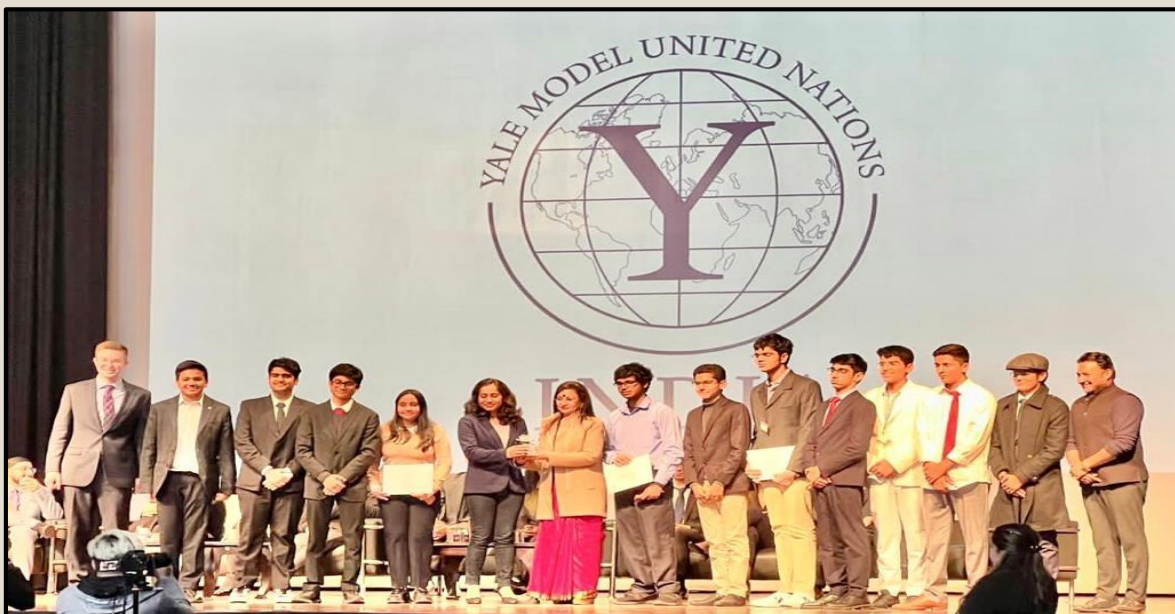




Glimpses from the evacuation drill.

The mock drill for earthquake evacuation was conducted at Modern School, Barakhamba Road on Thursday, 28th December at 1.40 pm in Middle Block wing for classes S1, S2 & S3. The primary goal of the exercise was to assess the preparedness and response capabilities of students, teachers, and staff in the event of an earthquake. The evacuation drill began immediately after the security alarm rang. All the students with their bags and their respective subject teachers vacated the school building and assembled in the front lawn. The students and teachers were instructed to follow designated evacuation routes shared by the Disaster Management Department. This drill was organized to check the readiness of the school to face any such emergency or any natural calamity and to make the students and the staff members aware about the rescue operation.

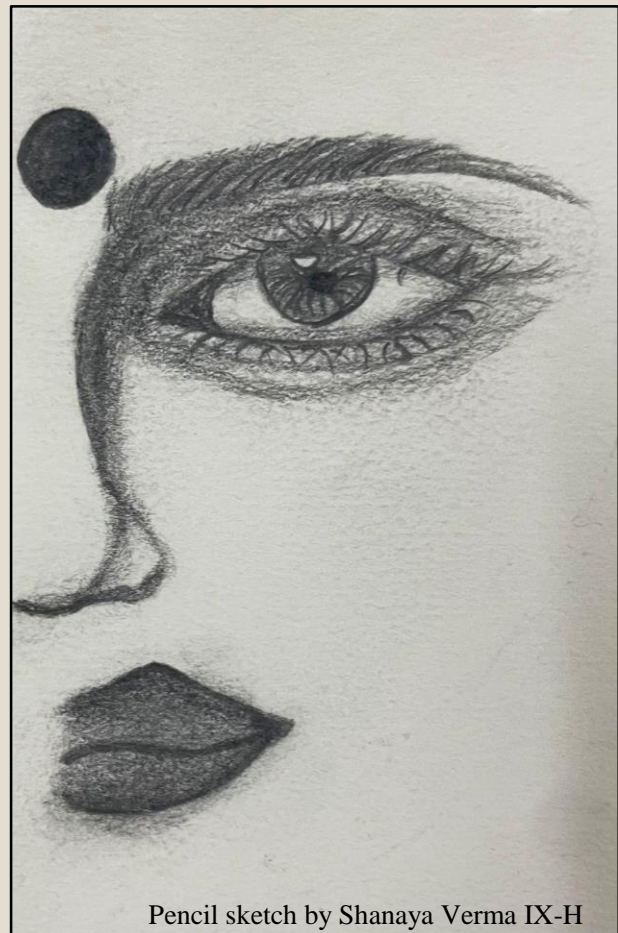
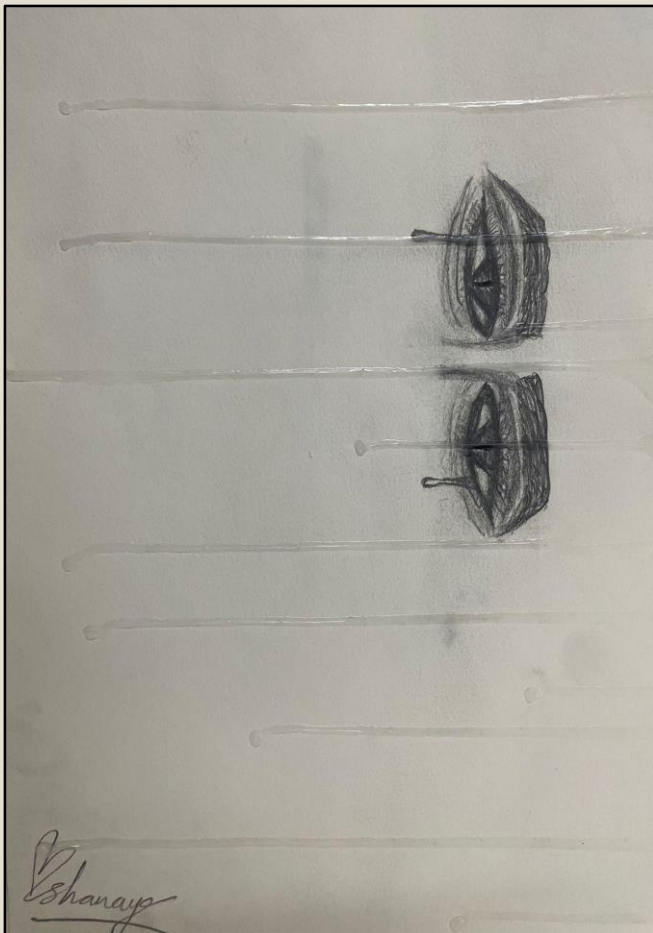
Modern School delegates at the Yale MUN.
