The Harit Umang Olympiad organised by Panasonic India in collaboration with the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Digital India and Bureau of Energy Efficiency is a year-long school awareness programme which culminated on June 3rd 2024.



Students from Classes 8 to 12 represented the Nature Club of Modern Barakhamba as the Green Ambassadors and participated in the Olympiad under the guidance of Ms Richa Bhatia. The Harit Umang Olympiad was based on four themes:

- Circular Economy through E-Waste Management
- Towards a Zero Plastic Zone
- Energy Conservation
- Biodiversity

The event witnessed participation of 250 schools across India, with a total of 400 students being a part of it. Out of the 400, 50 students made it to the final stage of the contest. Each theme had a separate set of competitions and activities in which the students participated throughout the year. The various events included an awareness campaign towards a zero plastic world, writing a Letter to the Prime Minister's Office with green energy proposals, the Harit Umang MUN, Essay Writing, multiple quizzes, e-waste management model making, Electricity saving drive, e-waste collection drive, Designing Sustainable Cities, Comic Strips and creation of every-day use items made from single use plastics and a series of webinars on the themes mentioned. Vedaanti Gupta and Nuvan Joneja of Class 9 won prizes in the categories 'Letter' to The PM' and 'Biodiversity Collage making' respectively. Ms Richa Bhatia won the award for the Best teacher Mentor. Modern School once again bagged the prize of overall winner amongst 50 schools and colleges from Delhi NCR.
