DISTRICT MEETING FOR NARCOTICS COORDINATION

The meeting for the District Level Committee for Narco Coordination was held on 21/08/2024, at the Disaster Management Centre, Humayun Road at 11:30 a.m. Though the meeting was convened under the chairmanship of The District Magistrate, New Delhi but he was absent there was a Bharat Bandh on that day. The meeting was therefore conducted by the Sub Division Magistrate or SDM.

Some of the members who attended the meeting were : Deputy Commissioner of Police New Delhi District, Director Education NDMC, Director Education MCD, Deputy Commissioner Kendriya Vidyalaya, Deputy Commissioner of Police IGI Airport, Commandent CISF etc. Representatives of Principal's of different colleges like Maitreyi, Gargi, ARSD, Motilal Nehru and JNU attended the meeting. Representatives of different schools of Delhi like Carmel Convent, Jain Happy Senior Secondary school, St. Thomas School were also present. Mrs. Anuradha Maini represented Modern School, Barakhamba Road, in this meeting.

Participants discussed the necessity for colleges to maintain vigilant oversight of hawkers operating outside campus grounds. The meeting also included inquiries directed at schools regarding the prevalence of drugs among students. Most schools reported that tobacco posed a more substantial threat than narcotics. The Sub-Divisional Magistrate (SDM) emphasized the importance of initiating pledges against drug usage within various educational institutions. It was noted that the Modern School had already conducted such a pledge on August 16, 2024, under the auspices of the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment.

The recent meeting convened by the Deputy Commissioner addressed significant concerns regarding the trafficking and use of drugs, particularly ganja, within Delhi. The Deputy Commissioner informed attendees about the confiscation of various drugs, noting that many were being transported into the city through multiple air and road routes. In response to this alarming situation, the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) has been alerted to enhance surveillance.

The Narcotics Cell provided an update on the procurement of medical drugs from local pharmacies and detailed the actions taken in response to this issue. The SDM further sought information on the measures implemented by schools to tackle tobacco-related problems, learning that the institutions were adhering to the National Tobacco Control Programme as mandated by the Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act (COTPA).

Additionally, the Narcotics Cell urged all educational institutions, including schools and colleges, to commit to pledges against the use of narcotics and to compile reports on these initiatives. Finally, all members present were informed that future meetings would be scheduled to occur on the last Friday of every month, ensuring continued collaboration in addressing these pressing concerns.
