

The event showcased the critical thinking and oratory skills of students from all Houses through three intense rounds and was judged by Ms Mona Jayant Patras and Ms Dimpy Mathur, esteemed teachers from Bhartiya Vidya Bhawan. The competition began with a challenging extempore round, where 32 participants spoke impromptu on a range of contemporary and abstract topics. Following a highly engaging and thought-provoking session, six Houses—Nehru, Ranjit, Tilak, Shastri, Laxmibai, and Kalam—emerged victorious and advanced to the final rounds.

Tanmay Sharma (Class 11 C) from Ranjit House and Laavanya Bhagwati (Class 11 J) from Shastri House, were declared the Most Promising Speakers in this round.

The finals featured two formats: the 2v2 debate and the dynamic block and tackle round. In the 2v2 debates, teams presented structured arguments on pressing issues, displaying strong logic, rebuttal, and teamwork.
