The newest sensation, Pratika Rawal, is a prodigy, groomed on the fields of Modern Barakhamba. She has been making waves in the sports world for her exceptional skills. She made her debut in the International Cricket on December 22, 2024, against the West Indies. She wasted no time in making an impression, displaying composure and skill beyond her years. On January 15, 2025, she scored her first ODI century, smashing 154 runs against Ireland. In the same match, she helped set the highest ODI total for India, with 435 runs, by forming a 233-run stand with captain, Smriti

Mandhana. She is the only cricketer, male or female, to score more than 400 runs in her first six innings, a feat that highlights her consistency from the very beginning of her international career. In doing so, she has also broken the Netherlands' Tom Cooper's record of 392 runs in the first six innings. Pratika is one of the few cricketers to be praised for both her technical skills and mental strength at such an early stage of her career. With her talent and smart approach to the game, she is set to be one of the cornerstones of Indian Cricket for years to come.


