They won the 1st T20 Women Cricket World Cup for Blind, beating Nepal at the P Sara Oval Cricket Grounds in Sri Lanka on 23rd November 2025.

The team gave an outstanding performance during the series by winning all the matches by big margins.

The ceremony began with Modern Barakhamba students presenting a dance on the song 'We are the Champion' which was apt for the occasion. MUN TRAINING SESSION

On 24th November 2025, Modern Barakhamba MUN Society hosted a training session for students of class 8, 9 and 11 on the conduct of Model United Nations, a platform that helps students develop diplomacy, critical thinking, public speaking and an understanding of global issues. The skill development session fostered efficiency, by the means of training MUN aspirants by introducing them to the basics of MUN Rules of Procedure.

The session was hosted by Mr Yashweer Kharb and M. Aman Kotecha - seasoned experts in public dealing, career counselling and MUN trainings across the country.

The speakers posed a poignant question to the students – ‘Why do we do MUN?’. Varied answers followed, ranging from improving their general awareness about world issues, to the importance of honing research skills. The session involved the presentation on the components of debate including content originality, real life examples, and the importance of tone and delivery. They explained a model of communication comprising largely the role of body language in communication, the importance of appropriate attire and conversational dynamics when trying to sway a committee in the right direction. This training equipped students with the skills and confidence to excel in the forthcoming MUN competitions.
