DEBATING SOCIETY TRAINING SESSION

The Debating Society conducted an engaging and insightful training session for the students of Class 11 on 16th May and 6th June, 2025 under the guidance of Ms Meghna Kapoor. The session on 16th May 2025, aimed to introduce the fundamentals of debate while equipping students with the skills and confidence to effectively present and defend arguments.

The workshop opened with a comprehensive overview of various debating formats, rules, and judging criteria. This was followed by interactive segments focusing on the essential components of a debate — structuring arguments, formulating rebuttals, and delivering speeches with clarity and persuasion.

To offer a more practical perspective, students were guided step-by-step through the debate structure and given tips on how to efficiently prepare a case in advance. Valuable insights were shared by Ishaani Aggarwal and Aarav Bajaj, former Presidents of the Debating Society, who drew from their personal experiences to demonstrate real-world strategies for navigating complex motions and responding under pressure.

Building on this foundation, an Online Intra-School Debate was held on 6th June 2025, giving students an opportunity to apply their learning in a competitive setting. The event featured two rounds- a prepared round, where participants developed arguments in advance, and an impromptu round, designed to test their ability to think quickly and respond spontaneously.

Participants were assessed on the strength and coherence of their arguments, effectiveness of their rebuttals, delivery, and overall engagement with the motion. The debate witnessed a rich diversity of viewpoints and dynamic exchanges, highlighting the participants' critical thinking and eloquence.

The session not only sharpened the students' debating abilities but also fostered a spirit of intellectual curiosity, respectful discourse, and collaborative learning.
