Visit to AIIMS

On the occasion of the 70th Foundation Day of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) Delhi, students of Biology section of Class 12, accompanied by Ms Richa Bhatia, HOD, Biology, had the golden opportunity to visit the prestigious institute and witness an exhibition that was truly one of a kind on Thursday, 25th September 2025.



The event brought together 54 different departments of AIIMS, each showcasing their expertise, research, and innovations. The students experienced a wide range of activities, including skin and hair analysis by the Plastic Surgery Department, retina and vision tests, and demonstrations of instruments such as braille codes, eye telescopes, and devices used by visually impaired people. They also learned CPR and participated in camps that checked blood sugar, blood pressure, and BMI. The Neuro Department conducted mental health and attention span tests, making them aware of the importance of psychological well-being. They were offered healthy refreshments, an initiative by the Department of Dietetics, which also educated them about nutritious and unhealthy foods.

They learned about forensic sciences, including types of poisons and how to deal with such cases. The Oncology Department emphasized that smoking, alcohol, and poor diet are leading causes of cancer, while many cancers like breast, lung, and cervical cancer can be prevented through a healthy lifestyle. They also explored the stem cell facility, admired artwork by patients, and gained awareness from the ENT Department about hearing problems, tinnitus, and voice hygiene.



The visit to AIIMS Delhi was a resounding success. It provided students with a unique opportunity to explore the medical field and to interact with healthcare professionals. The experience was both inspiring and educational, reinforcing the importance of medical advancements and patient care.
